<b>Duties:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Read and interpret layouts, engineering drawings, work orders, or verbal instructions to plan welding work.</li> <li>• Determine the appropriate welding equipment or method based on requirements, with guidance from the Welding Supervisor.</li> <li>• Configure and operate tools common to the welding trade, such as shielded metal arc and gas metal arc welding equipment.</li> <li>• MIG or TIG weld aluminum components using manual or semi-automatic welding equipment in various positions (vertical, horizontal, or overhead).</li> <li>• Inspect outputs to ensure they meet design specifications and applicable regulatory requirements.</li> <li>• Notify the Welding Supervisor of defective material or equipment.</li> <li>• Follow company procedures to maintain welding equipment.</li> <li>• Wear appropriate PPE and demonstrate safe welding practices.
